BALL STRIKER REPORT

FARMSTEAD TAKEOVER

Team Perry Seizes Control and Delivers a Dominant Ryder Cup Performance — While Yamba Erases a 34-Point Deficit to Take the Shippen Cup Lead

The weather was nearly perfect. The course was ready. And 20 Ball Strikers made the trip to Farmstead in Lafayette, New Jersey, on Saturday, August 15, for a different kind of stop on the 2026 Ball Strikers Tour.

Farmstead provided the backdrop for the club's Ryder Cup-style team competition, featuring Team Perry Medina versus Team DeLano Bonner.

From the opening tee shots through the final putts — and eventually into the 19th hole — the day delivered a healthy combination of competition, teamwork and camaraderie.

A time was had by all.

There was one significant development before the competition even began.

Team Perry captain and 2025 Ball Strikers Gross Champion Perry Medina



was a late scratch, leaving his squad to compete without its captain in the field.

Team Perry, however, proved resilient.

Not only did the group respond to the absence of its captain — it took control of the competition almost immediately.

By the time the opening three groups were finished, Team Perry had built a staggering 66-6 advantage, establishing a level of dominance that ultimately proved impossible to overcome.

When all 120 points were accounted for, Team Perry had secured an emphatic:

Farmstead wasn't a traditional Ball Strikers stroke-play event. Instead, the 18-hole competition was divided into three six-hole segments, requiring players to adjust their approach throughout the round.

HOLES 1-6 — ALTERNATE SHOT

The opening six holes placed the emphasis squarely on teamwork. Partners played alternate shot from tee to green, with each player responsible for setting up his teammate for the next shot. One golfer's drive became his partner's approach. His partner's approach determined the next shot. Every decision and every swing affected two players instead of one. Communication, patience and trust were at a premium.

**HOLES 7-12 — HANDI-
CAPPED TEAM MATCH
PLAY**

The middle six transitioned into handicapped team match play. With handicaps incorporated into the competition, each pairing had an opportunity to earn points for its respective team while going head-to-head with the opposing duo. Momentum could change quickly, and every hole presented another opportunity to put points on the board.

HOLES 13-18 — INDIVIDUAL HEAD-TO-HEAD

Then the partnerships gave way to individual competition. The final six holes featured individual head-to-head match play, putting each Striker directly against an opponent with points for the team on the line. After 12 holes of relying on a partner, the closing six placed the responsibility squarely on each individual golfer. It made for a fitting conclusion to the Ryder Cup format.

TEAM PERRY TAKES COMMAND

Despite competing without its captain, Team Perry wasted little time establishing itself. Michael Conrad and Joe McLaughlin set the tone in the opening match. The duo controlled the first two team portions of the competition, with Conrad adding four more points during the individual segment. By the time the opening foursome completed its round, Team Perry had secured a 24-0 advantage.

Then came Keith Davenport and Zack Yamba. The Team Perry pairing again controlled both team segments before the individual matches divided some of the remaining points. Yamba finished with 20 match points, while Davenport contributed 18, giving Team Perry another 22-2 advantage.

Just two groups into the competition, Team Perry had built an imposing 46-2 lead.

WARD & CAROTHERS KEEP THE PRESSURE ON

The third match featured Team DeLano captain DeLano Bonner and Anthony Darby against Greg Ward and Terry Carothers. Ward and Carothers continued Team Perry's torrid start, collecting the available points from the first two team segments. The individual portion produced a split, with Darby collecting four points for Team DeLano while Ward earned four for Team Perry. The result was another 20-4 advantage for Team Perry.

Through the first three groups:

TEAM PERRY 66 — TEAM DELANO — 6

Team Perry had seized complete control of the Ryder Cup.

TEAM DELANO RESPONDS

The final two groups belonged to Team DeLano. Ray Woolfolk and Kirk Hart provided the team's biggest push of the afternoon, capturing all 16 available points during the first two team segments against Larry Jones and Burnell Williams. Jones and Williams answered during individual play, collecting eight points for Team Perry, but Woolfolk and Hart had done enough to secure a 16-8 group victory.

The fifth and final match proved to be the closest overall contest of the day. Charles Smith and Greg Whitaker squared off

against Sebastian Sepulveda and Jesse Branson. The opening Alternate Shot segment finished even at four points apiece before Smith and Whitaker captured the middle team segment. Sepulveda and Branson responded during the individual matches, but Team DeLano held on for a 14-10 victory.

Team DeLano closed the competition by taking the final two groups by a combined 30-18. But Team Perry's opening surge had already determined the direction of the day.

Team Perry collected an incredible 66 of the first 72 available points through the opening three groups. Team DeLano deserves credit for responding and winning the final two groups, but Team Perry's early control and dominance proved decisive.

FARMSTEAD'S TOP MATCH-POINT EARNERS

Three Strikers shared the top individual match-point total for the event:

Michael Conrad — 20 points

Zack Yamba — 20 points

Greg Ward — 20 points

All three represented Team Perry. Keith Davenport followed with 18 points, while Terry Carothers, Raymond Woolfolk and Kirk Hart each collected 16. But the Ryder Cup carried another important reward beyond the points earned during the matches.

WINNING HAD ITS REWARDS

As members of the victorious Ryder Cup squad, each member of Team Perry was awarded an additional 20 Shippen Cup points for the team victory. That made the outcome at Farmstead particularly important to the season-long standings. This wasn't simply a battle for bragging rights. The individual match points mattered. The team result mattered. And for Team Perry, winning carried a significant Shippen Cup reward.

FARMSTEAD SHAKES UP THE SHIPPEN CUP

The Ryder Cup wasn't the only competition affected by what happened at Farmstead. The event produced a significant shift in the season-long Shippen Cup race, with the

combination of individual performance and the winning-team award creating an opportunity for major movement. And nobody made a bigger move than Zack Yamba.

FROM 34 POINTS BACK TO NO. 1

Yamba arrived at Farmstead facing a substantial deficit. He entered the event 34 points behind the Shippen Cup leader. By the end of the afternoon, that deficit was gone. Yamba delivered one of Team Perry's strongest performances, earning 20 match points during the Ryder Cup competition. His performance, combined with the points associated with Team Perry's victory, turned Farmstead into a major inflection point in his Shippen Cup campaign. By the time the points were totaled, Yamba had erased the 34-point deficit and vaulted all the way into first place with 221.25 points.

A 34-point deficit had become a 1.25-point lead. And the golfers behind him aren't going anywhere.

THE SHIPPEN CUP IS WIDE OPEN

Greg Ward sits second with 220 points, just 1.25 points behind Yamba. Greg Cavanaugh is third with 215 points, only 6.25 points from the top. Mike Conrad, another of Farmstead's 20-point performers, strengthened his position as well and sits fourth with 196.67 points. Behind Conrad, Burnell Williams (179), Raymond Woolfolk (176) and Anthony Darby (169) remain positioned in the upper portion of the standings.

Farmstead didn't simply tighten the Shippen Cup race. It changed the leader. Yamba erased a 34-point deficit to take first. Ward sits only 1.25 points behind. Cavanaugh is only 6.25 points from the top.

With the regular season approaching its conclusion, the Shippen Cup is setting up for a sprint to the finish.

FARMSTEAD DELIVERS BEYOND THE SCORE-CARD

With the competition settled and the Shippen Cup points accounted for, there was still another part of the Farmstead experience worth noting. Farmstead proved itself to be a welcoming venue for the Ball Strikers beyond the golf itself — a point that should not go unnoticed. Not every venue on the Ball Strikers schedule offers the same opportunity for members to remain together and socialize throughout the day and after the round. Farmstead provided both.

Around the turn, the course featured a convenient mid-round food shack, giving the contingent an opportunity to grab snacks, drinks and other delectables before teeing off on No. 10. Several Strikers took advantage of the stop, providing a welcome opportunity to refuel before heading into the back nine.

But Farmstead may have made its strongest impression after the final putts dropped. As has become customary following a Ball Strikers event, the competition didn't necessarily end at the 18th green. Several members gathered in the parking lot for an informal 19th hole, where the day's matches were revisited, shots were recounted and the normal post-round conversation continued. And, as often happens in golf, a few of those shots may have gotten a little better with each retelling.

From the parking lot, the gathering eventually moved to Farmstead's outdoor dining area, where members were able to settle in for food, libations and more conversation about the day's competition. That may sound like a small detail, but for a club like the Ball Strikers, it matters.

Our events have always been about more than posting a score. The opportunity to sit together after a round, talk about what happened on the course, enjoy a meal and spend time as a group is part of what makes an event memorable. Not every course we visit provides accommodations that allow that experience to continue once the golf is finished.

Farmstead did.

The golf brought the Strikers to Lafayette. The 19th hole helped complete the experience.

A DIFFERENT KIND OF BALL STRIKERS SATURDAY

Ultimately, Farmstead was about more than the 84-36 on the scoreboard. For six holes, every Striker had to trust his partner enough to hit the next shot. For another six, teammates battled together in handicapped match play. Over the final six, each player was asked to stand on his own and earn whatever points he could for the team. And after those 18 holes were completed, members still had an opportunity to gather, eat, drink, laugh and relive the day's competition. That combination made Farmstead a particularly good fit for the Ball Strikers.

Twenty Strikers. A nearly perfect summer day. Three different competitive formats. Five matches. And plenty of camaraderie before, during and after the golf.

Team DeLano finished strong. Team Perry started stronger. And despite the late scratch of its captain, Team Perry proved resilient enough to carry the day and bring home the 84-36 victory.

NEXT STOP – CREAM RIDGE

With Farmstead now in the books, the Ball Strikers have entered the closing stretch of the 2026 regular season. On Saturday, August 22, the Strikers head to Cream Ridge Golf Course in Upper Freehold Township, Monmouth County, New Jersey, for a makeup event and one of the final tests of the regular season. The first tee time is scheduled for 10:00 AM. And with the Shippen Cup race transformed by Farmstead, Cream Ridge takes on even greater significance.

Yamba now leads Ward by just 1.25 points. Cavanaugh is only 6.25 points from first. Conrad remains within striking distance. For those at the top – and those trying to chase them down – there aren't many opportunities left to make a move.

KEEP AN EYE ON MOTHER NATURE

There is one storyline to watch ahead of Cream Ridge:

The weather.

The forecast has shown the potential for rain in the Cream Ridge area. Conditions will be worth monitoring as the event approaches. The first tee remains set for 10:00 AM Saturday morning, and the Strikers will hope Mother Nature cooperates long enough to get another important event into the books.

THEN IT'S ON TO A CLUB FAVORITE – ARCHITECTS

After Cream Ridge, the regular-season journey moves to a familiar and popular destination. Architects Golf Club is next on the schedule and has become a Ball Strikers favorite. But this year's visit will feature something new. On Friday, August 28, the Ball Strikers will stage the club's inaugural non-weekend event, taking the tour into a Friday for the first time. It's a different wrinkle for the schedule and an opportunity to spend a late-summer

Friday at a course the club has come to enjoy.

And as we approach the end of another season, let's hope for a strong turnout from the membership as the Strikers take on one of the final regular-season tests of 2026. From there, attention turns toward the biggest test on the calendar — the Ball Strikers Club Championship at Neshanic.

FARMSTEAD IS IN THE BOOKS.

20 Strikers.

18 holes.

Three formats.

120 Ryder Cup points.

An 84-36 Team Perry victory.

A 34-point Shippen Cup deficit erased.

A new leader atop the standings.

One nearly perfect day for golf.

And a proper 19th hole to finish it.
